Midwives lobby MPs for pay DUNGS

THE HOME Birth Association says it will lobby every Member of Parliament this year about payment for domiciliary midwives.

The association's newlyelected national president, Mrs Henriette Kemp, said domiciliary midwives could not afford to do home births fulltime. Even if they had a full case load in a year they would only earn \$8000 from the maternity services benefit.

"We feel that domiciliary midwifery is a valuable and worthy fulltime profession which is deserving of the same salary as a hospital midwife," she said.

Mrs Kemp said it was ridiculous having a law saying every woman had a right to a home birth if the Government did not provide the necessary services.

In areas such as Wellington, Auckland and Northland there was a severe shortage of domiciliary midwives because they had been forced out of their jobs as a result of the low pay.

In other areas it was difficult to have a home delivery because of restraints placed on midwives by local hospital boards and district health offices.

Mrs Kemp, who is Wellington co-ordinator of the Home Birth Association, was elected national president at the association's fourth annual conference in Auckland last week-
