MATTERS ARISING:

- 1) VIDEO: print has been seen, and final editing is done. Nicky says she can get prints, need quote for between 30 & 40 (some for other associations, one for each Auckland group, approx. 5 to hire out). Marjet to get quote from F&P. Suggested price to sell is \$50, to hire out \$10. (hirer to pay for return to AHBA).
- 2) COMPUTER: We have bought a Mac classic; price including software programme & 10 discs comes to \$4000. Jackie has investigated price of insurance & best deal is approx. \$290/year for \$10,000 worth of goods. We'll need computer table, etc. Linda to check on this.
