The YWCA is an international network of women working for women in every part of the world. Since 1886 the Auckland 'Y' has adopted world policy appropriate to New Zealand women and has been involved in a very wide range of activities in response to the changing needs of women over the last 100 years. In recent times the main focus has been on accommodation and recreation, but the sale of the uneconomic Queen Street hostels meant that many facilities were no longer available for programmes, and new directions were sought.

The Auckland YWCA in the 80s continues to respond to the expressed needs of women, facilitating and assisting in the establishment of projects such as;

- : promoting self defence classes for women of all ages.
- : developing child care, leisure and education activities for mothers and children.
- : developing women's resource systems.
- : working with young women 'at risk'.
- : co-ordinating marketing and learning systems for craftswomen.

The staff and board of the 'Y' are eager to expand their activities and the support of Auckland women is needed to increase effectively our contribution to the community.

"CRAFTYWOMEN"

Dear Women,

In December 1982 the Auckland Y.W.C.A. began a new venture, opening a retailing service for craftswomen. "Y" staff were aware that the work of many craftswomen was inhibited by the lack of a market place, that many women could fully or partially support themselves by selling their work and that others could develop their art/craft skills if they were reimbursed for materials and time.

Following discussion with staff the Board of the "Y" agreed to fund the establishment and initial running costs of a shop and a month later "CRAFTYWOMEN" opened with seventy women supplying a broad range of goods.

Now that the Christmas rush and holiday lull are both over we are aware of the need to promote "CRAFTYWOMEN" in the market place. The craftswomen have made the first step toward independence and now the support of Auckland women is needed to make the venture a total success.
