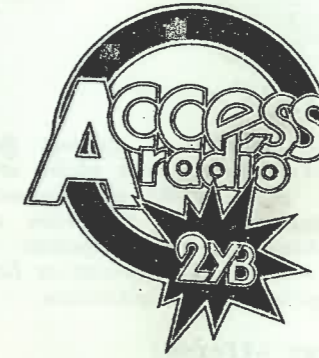
CLARE NOLAN, an Access staffer who has been on maternity leave, has submitted her resignation. "Best of luck, Clare. You'll be missed!"

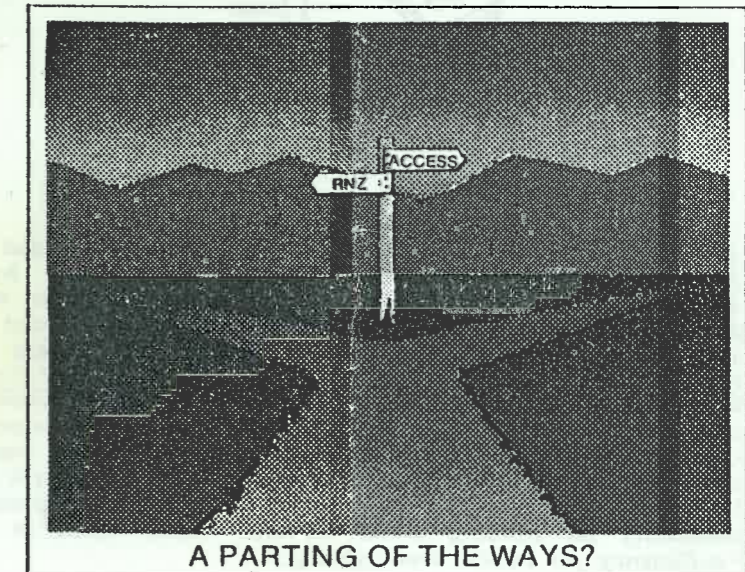

In an address to the Music Federation of New Zealand, on the 20th of April, the Minister of Broadcasting, Jonathan Hunt, outlined Radio New Zealand's plans for the next four years. The Board is trying to turn Radio NZ into a trim fighting ship to meet the challenges of an increasingly competitive, commercialised market. Not surprisingly, Access - one of the last bastions of non-commercial, public service radio - is a prime candidate for the pruning knife. (cont'd...)



A PARTING OF THE WAYS?

Here are some excerpts from the Minister's speech:

"(The Broadcasting Corporation) has been looking at options for introducing new or enhanced minority interest radio services which are within the policy of the present government, such as the development of Maori, Polynesian and Access radio stations, and extension of parliamentary and sports broadcasts. This has been against a background of clear limits to the resources which the Corporation has available for expansion and development of social service activities.

The Minister looked at what the package offered:

"...development of Maori radio stations in Auckland - with a relay station in the Bay of Plenty - and separate stations in Wellington and Christchurch...
Development of Access radio and Polynesian services in Auckland and Wellington."



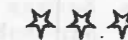
SPONSORS?

"...SPONSOR FUNDING to develop and maintain new social services would be sought...Maori stations could be funded by trusts incorporation and the Maori Affairs Department with limited commercial programming. Educational broadcasting could be funded by the Community Educational Consortium. Polynesian and Access Radio in Auckland and Wellington could similarly be funded by User Groups.
...The development of Sponsor funding would extend social service broadcasting without requiring specific licence fee increases. This extension of social services would create a new style of broadcasting because of the unique interaction of community interests with Radio New Zealand in formal programme warrant Associations. Spreading the responsibility for funding social services would result in improved self-sufficiency for Public Broadcasting."

The complete plan could be accomplished over a four year period.... I personally see a great deal of merit in these concepts, and I will be inviting interested parties to let me have their comments."

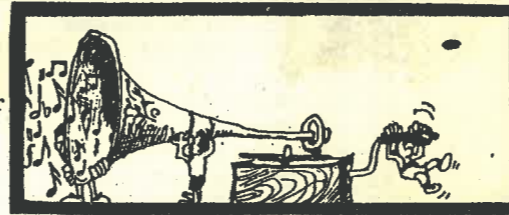

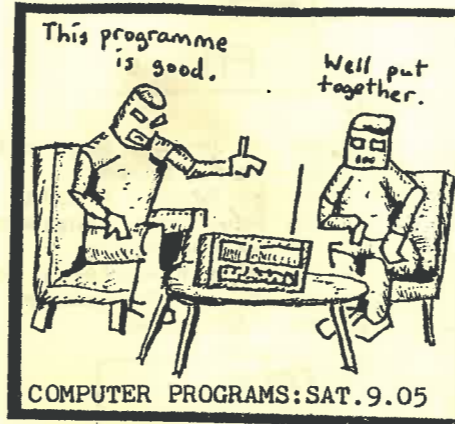

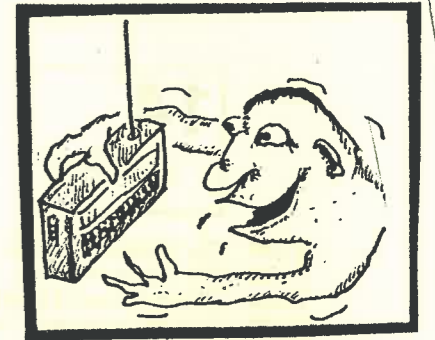
