Punk, from the pioneers to the present, and heavy metal - make the radio jump.



Our other departure is fortunately only a temporary one. The Women Zone Collective have decided to take a break from their weekly magazine programme for, by, and about women. The programme will return in the same form but at the new time of 10.00 am on Sunday mornings rather than its current spot of 11.00 am on Saturdays. The collective requested the time change because many of their members were busy on a Saturday morning so couldn't hear the programme. Part of the time vacated by Women Zone has been taken by the Gay Collective for a programme called Gay Collective. Each Saturday between 11.30 and 12.00 noon they'll cover whats-on, interviews, music, news, both local and international, and a weekly feature.




Hot on the heels of Herbs and the Patea Maori Club comes Aotearoa a young Maori band playing popular and reggae influenced original Maori music. Te Puawaitanga O Te Reo presenter and Aotearoa presenter Ngahiwi Apanui credits Herbs with having a strong influence on their music. "It seems to be a popular sound as we've had a good response so far from audiences." Among those who've been impressed is the rep for 'Rolling Stone' magazine, who is trying to get 2ZB to play their single and is also approaching Jayrem Records. In the meantime, Aotearoa will be performing as part of Orientation at Victoria University and on Te Puawaitanga O Te Reo. Today Access, tomorrow the world?

Tom Appleton's current venture 'The Sound Of Summer' comes to an end in March. Tom will not become idle however. He is turning his attention to a Yiddish programme to be called Lamir Alle Singen (Let Us Sing). Singings not all you'll hear; poetry and short stories also getting a look-in on a regular basis. #### ACCESS FOR NORTHLAND CLOSER

You may recall last year we mentioned a visit from Mark Derby, one of a group of people working towards an Access style programme for Northland. Well, Mark payed us a flying visit last week and the news was all good. Radio Northland, the local Radio New Zealand station, have offered the group an initial time of two hours per week, probably on a Sunday morning, and have been very helpful with advice and support. The call for groups wanting to get involved realised about one hundred replies and a meeting for these people was set up for February 12th to work on a format for the first few two-hour programmes which are planned for April this year. Northland's Access aspirants are based in Whangarei and are using our own 2YB Access as a model; their first programmes likely to be similar to our initial three hour broadcasts on Sunday mornings in 1981. We wish them well and hope to hear more.

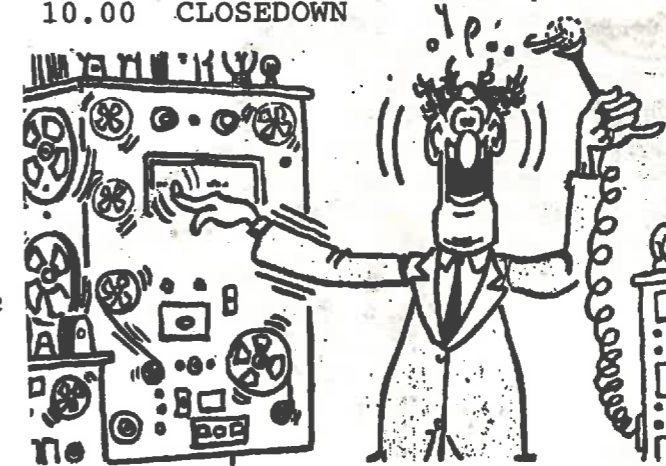
