# SUMMER SOUNDS on 783

1985 already! The new year brings some new summer sounds to the ever changing face of Access Radio. Tony Bowler and Evan Roberts are back with their bag of sound effect tricks and a line-up of lesser-known songs by popular artists. All this goes by the name of the Aberphonic Secret Music Slot - the secret is out so stay tuned. An area of jazz that has had limited exposure is jazz-rock fusion. Enthusiast Noel Hayvice is trying to change that with a series of four programmes on jazz rock fusion running until the 19th of January. From January 26th the Maori youth programme Rangatahi will replace Jazz-Rock Fusion at 6.30 pm. Glen Barclay hosts two 45 minute shows of African music on 12th and 19th of January at 1.00 pm and from the 26th Tom Appleton presents easy listening music tracks in a programme called The Sound Of Summer, which replaces African Music at 1.00 pm on Saturdays for a 6-week stretch. To complete the additions to our musical line-up Jeff Jones takes us back to the heyday of swing, combined with some early jazz and musicals. They Call It Nostalgia will play on Saturdays at 4.00 pm every fortnight. Jeff is also presenting an hour of twelve inch extended mix singles on January 26th at 9.00 pm.

On Wednesday 15th of December we held the Access Christmas Party ... and what a good night it was. It's one of the few opportunities many of our programme makers get to meet the other people who help make Access Radio the success that it is. The Minister of Broadcasting, Jonathan Hunt also took the opportunity to meet and talk to many of our programme presenters.

For the Access staff it was a welcome opportunity to have time for relaxed social chat with people who are usually under pressure of time and have to concentrate on just getting their programme done. Many thanks to all the people who brought a plate with them, the array of food was magnificent. I think we can say that a good time was had by all.

Those of you who attended the Christmas Party may have met Robin Nathan, Access Radio's newest recruit. Robin is working with us while Clare is away on maternity leave. Among other things she has worked in community theatre in Manakau, played percussion with the Pacific Peace Band, and walked around the East Cape performing theatre in schools with a group called 'Promezones'. Robin is keen to try her hand at film making but in the more immediate future she is interested in producing a programme of original children's stories. ## COMPUTER PROGRAMS FOR ALL

From February 2nd Access Radio will broadcast to a new listening audience; home computers!

Every Saturday morning at 9.00 am, computer program data for 'public domain' computer programs will be played on Access so that home computer owners can record the programs for their own use.

Each brand of computer has its own unique set of instructions so home computer clubs will take turns to broadcast programs for their users. Four clubs will be involved initially; Spectravideo, Commodore, BBC, and Spectrum will each broadcast monthly.

Transmissions will be about three minutes long, containing three or four programs depending on their length.

Educational programs, games, graphics, and utility programs will be covered, with all contributions to the programme being 'public domain' meaning they are written by individual computer users rather than by computer companies and may be copied by anyone. to copy a program involves making a cassette tape recording of the program from the radio and then putting the recording into the cassette facility of your home computer.



Each transmission will involve a brief description of the program followed by the program itself which will sound like heavy distortion and static.

The programme is partially in response to the large number of public domain programs that computer club members had to offer other users. The number of copies being made, one at a time, was overwhelming so broadcasting them on radio was an obvious solution.

The idea has been used successfully by the BBC in Britain and by Dutch National Radio in Holland but it has never before been tried in New Zealand.




